
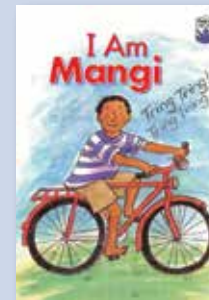

'Look up Grandpa! Your glasses are on your head,' says Zandi.

'So they are! Now I can read you a story!' says Grandpa.




In autumn Little Red Hen asked,
