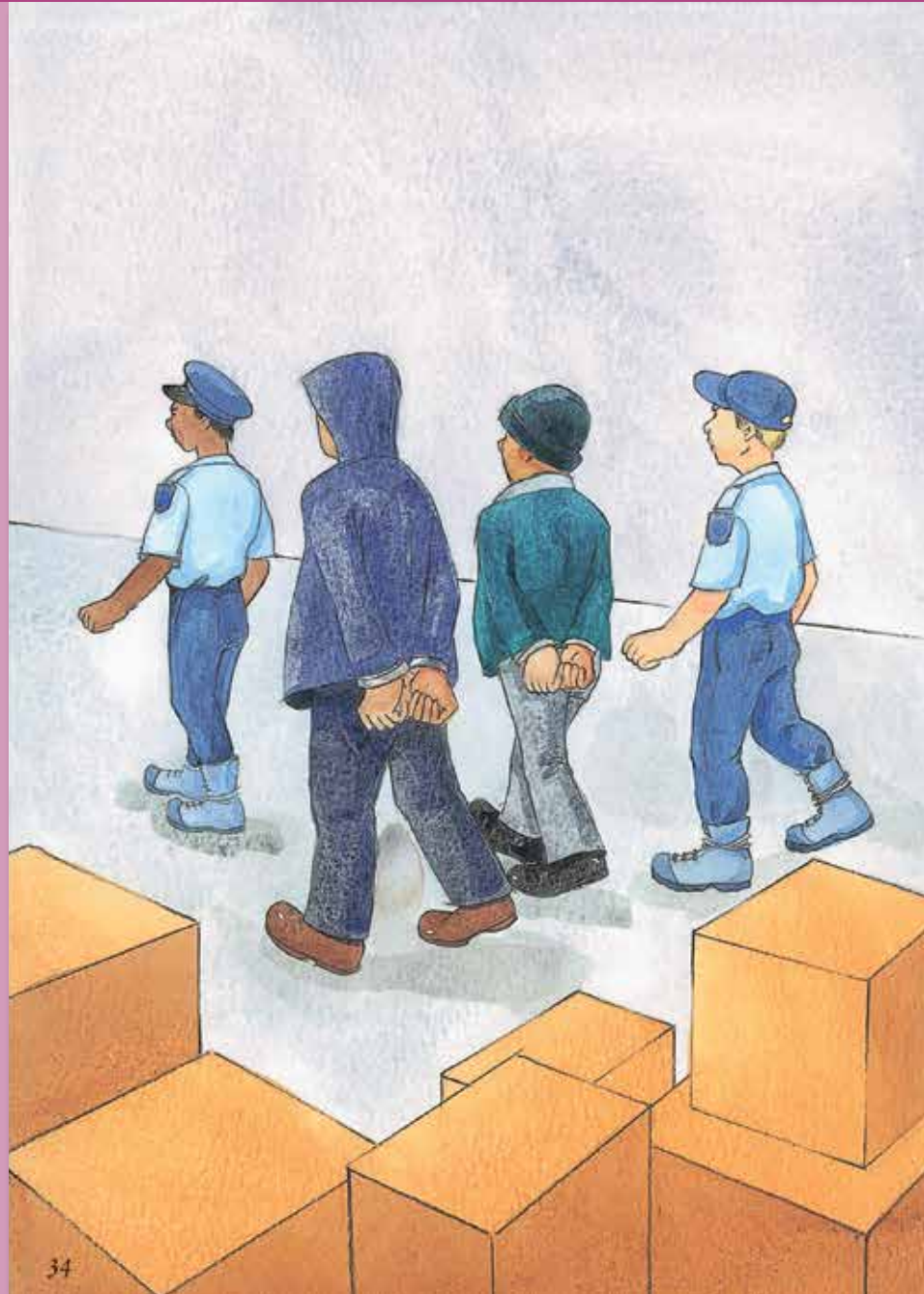
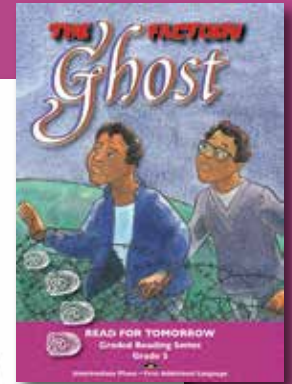


Thami took off his shirt and waded into the river to get the old bicycle frame out of the mud. Vuyisile watched from the side.

'Look out!' laughed Vuyisile. 'A crocodile will get you!'

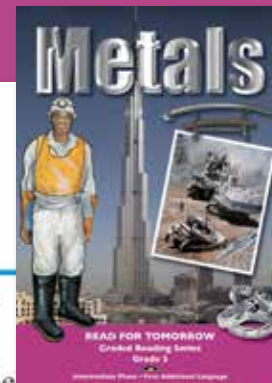
